Burnett & Washburn Counties promotes "backyard composting" of yard and garden waste. For information on how to start your own home backyard composting program, call 715-635-2197 ext. 244.

**Siren** - Private site for Village residents only. West of Siren, south of Hwy 70 on Nyberg Road (1/4 mile south) Wed 8 am - 4 pm & Sat 8 am - 5 pm.

**Spoooner** - Private site for Spoooner city residents only. Residents should call City Hall at 715-635-8769 for information.

**Grantsburg** - Private site for Village residents only. Old dump site on West Benson, north of town. April 1st thru Sept 30, 1st & 3rd Sat., 9 - 2; Oct 1 - Mar 31, 1st Sat., 9 - 1.

**A & H** - At the Recycling Drop-off site. This site only collects leaves and grass, no brush.

**Minong** - Private site at Transfer Station, call 715-466-2062 for info.

**Long Lake** - Private site at the recycling site for property owners only.

**Lake Area Landfill Sarona** - 715-469-3356 for info.

- No plastic bags
- See inside guide for locations and hours.
- Leaves, brush less than 6" in diameter, and grass are the only wastes accepted.

## FEES FOR RECYCLABLES

-Spoooner Site Only!

Appliances - Refrigerators, humidifiers, de-humidifiers, freezers, washers, dryers, stoves, dishwashers, water heaters, air conditioners, metal microwaves, furnaces - FREE

Tires - \$5.00/auto or light truck tire < 17"; \$8.00/tire 17-21"; \$15.00/tire 21" or more

Fluorescent Bulbs - \$.50 each for bulbs < 4' (includes CFL's & circulars). \$.75 each for bulbs > 4'

\$1.75 each for shatter-shield bulbs < 4' or \$2.25 for > 4'

\$2.00 each for tanning bed bulbs

\$2.50 each HID bulbs

Used Oil Filters - \$1.00 for all sizes.

Computer monitors-\$8.00 ea.

Computer CPU, keyboard/mouse/etc.-FREE

Electronics -VCR/DVD Blu-ray players, plastic microwaves, video game consoles, desktop printers, vacuums, radios, stereos, CB radios, speakers, battery power backups, satellite receivers & dishes, telephones (old style/cordless), electronic typewriters and others -\$5.00 ea.

Floor-style copiers/printers-\$50.00 ea.

T.V.s-The **Spoooner Recycling Site only**: \$15-< 21", \$25-21" - 41", \$35- > 41", \$45-wood console any size, \$60-projection any size.

## PREPARATION

No need to sort or separate these items.

**PLEASE! - DUMP ALL MATERIAL LOOSE INTO THE DROP BOX.....REUSE YOUR BAGS OR BOXES.**

**Newspaper**- Glossy inserts delivered with newspaper are acceptable. Keep newsprint dry. Do not tie with twine, string or other materials.

**Glass**- Rinse ALL containers clean. Need not remove labels. Unacceptable - Ceramics, clay pots, drinking glasses or dishes, light bulbs, mirror or window glass, ovenware or crystal.

**Aluminum/Tin/Steel food grade cans**-labels need not be taken off of cans. Rinse cans clean. No scrap metal in bins.

**Paper Products**-Magazines, paper bags, glossy-advertising, glossy inserts and catalogs, all types of clean office and school paper, post-it notes, junk mail, Tetra Pak, and phone books. Staples and envelopes with windows are acceptable, no paper clips, metal, cloth or plastic bindings. Please note that tissue papers, food- contaminated paper, paper plates etc. are not acceptable under any category.

**Plastics**-Check containers closely to determine recyclability. ONLY #1, #2, & #5's are currently accepted. Absolutely NO automotive product bottles regardless of number. Rinse bottles clean. Leave caps on. Plastic Bags and Film are no longer accepted. Styrofoam is NOT ACCEPTED.

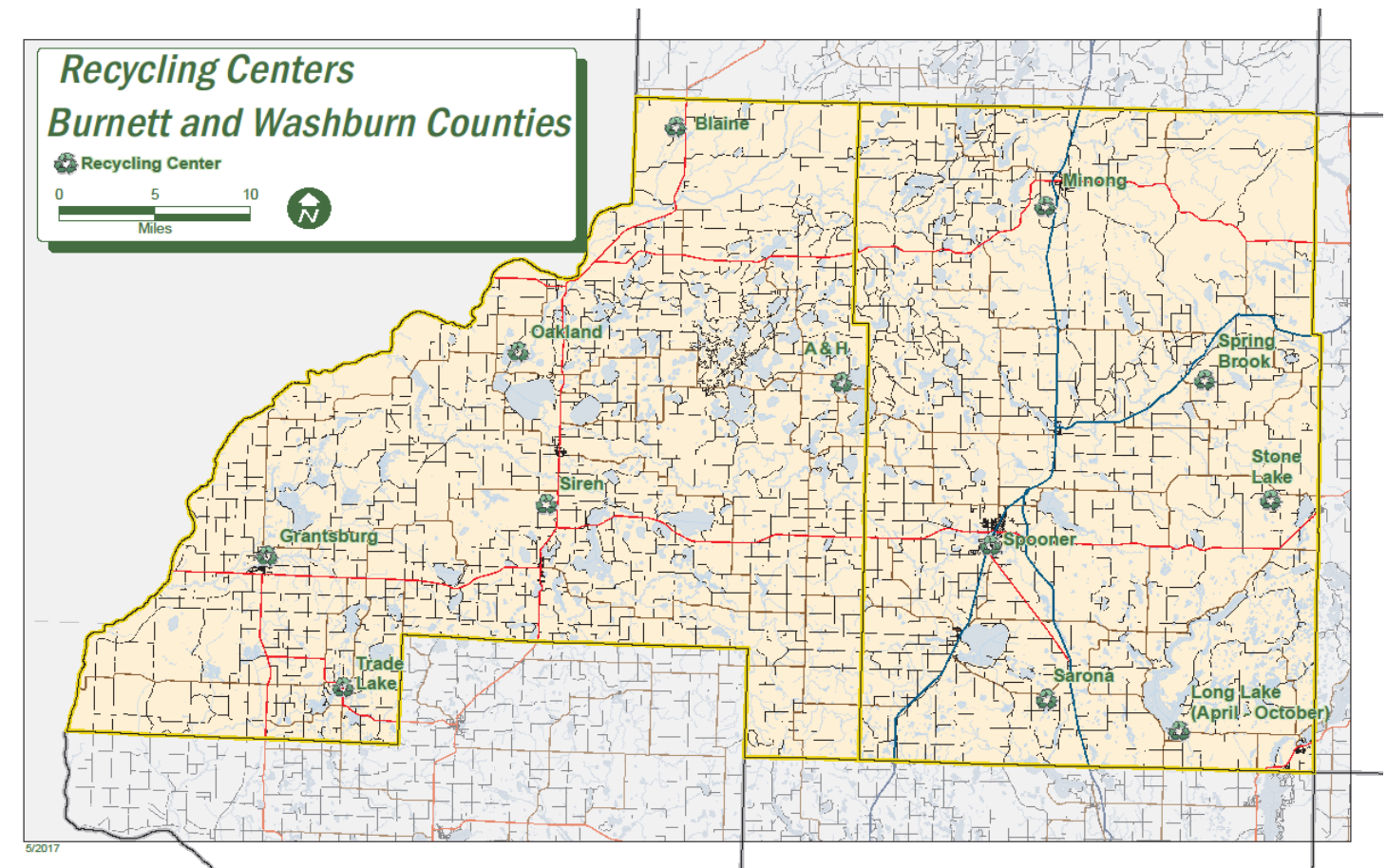
**Cardboard**-Clean boxboard (cereal type box), and rinsed paper beverage containers like Tetra Paks accepted in bins. Corrugated cardboard accepted at all sites, check inside guide for locations. Please break down ALL boxes to help conserve space.

**DO NOT LEAVE ANYTHING AT RECYCLING CENTERS WHEN THEY ARE CLOSED OR YOU MAY BE FINED.**

Residents and businesses with curbside garbage collection - Area waste haulers are to provide you with recycling services, or with information on where recycling collection locations are located. Please call your hauler for specific program details. **RCC grant funding does not allow monies to be spent on disposing of business generated materials; that is the cost and responsibility of doing business.**
